Old, broken specimens are difficult, and sometimes impossible to identify. **Do not use** tape or sticky materials; these will damage your specimen. Be sure to use a clean, tightly closed, crush-proof container. Sealed ziplock bags inside a box, padded or bubble-wrap envelope are acceptable. **Live insects cannot be mailed.** Please submit **at least five intact** specimens.
