Sources of Horse Manure: Manure from these sources may be partially decomposed. Allow manure to fully decompose over the winter or in a compost heap before using in your garden. Do NOT use hot manure or compost – it must cool down to ambient air temperature or it will harm plants.

Sources of Wood Chips: Many tree services will give you fresh wood chips when they are working in your neighborhood. It is best to allow these wood chips to decompose before use. Do not apply mulch that is hot or has a strong, sour smell to your garden – you may store it until it cools and the odor has dissipated. Mulch with a pleasant “woody” odor is safe to use.
